## PRESIDENTS REPORT - 2011

### INTRODUCTION

The 2010 - 2011 year of my presidency has been an interesting and progressive year for the Association with many activities and highlights summarised further in this report.

### VOLUNTEERS / COMMITTEE MEMBERS

Starting the year without a Secretary or Assistant Secretary was a bit daunting, however those positions have been filled and the Committee has worked well.

Some major items that have come out of the Committee are;

- Lease contracts for the Canteen, Pro shop and the Cleaner have been finalised and signed by both parties.

Maintenance continues to have a major cost. This year, the following maintenance works were commenced;

- Underpinning of the building (late 2010); and
